Regulations and Syllabi for the

Three Month Certificate Programme on Manuscript Studies

A. About the Programme:

- 1. **Programme Title:** Three Month Certificate Programme on *Manuscript Studies* herein after called as CPMS
- 2. **Programme Objectives:** The CPMS Programme is primarily designed for two important objectives
 - a) To provide the basic knowledge of original script of Assamese language and learn to reading in old Assamese manuscript
 - b) To provide basic knowledge of, which may help the learners to have a clear hands-on understanding of the distinguished performing art form and develop a systematic foundation for further learning.
- 3. **Extent of the Programme:** The Programme will be completed within 3 Months from admission to declaration of result.
- 4. **Year of Effect:** The CPMS shall be offered by the Majuli University of Culture effect from the academic session 2023-2024.

5. **Course Structure:** The CPMS Programme shall have 2 (two) courses containing the following components-

6. Conduct of the Programme:.

The CPMS Programme shall be conducted under the Department of Assamese, Majuli University of Culture. Course Coordinator- **Dr. Utpal Narayan Goswami**, Coordinator, IQAC, Majuli University of Culture. The Admission process, transection of courses, conduct of examinations, evaluation process and declaration of results shall be coordinated by this Department.

B. Admission Eligibility and Criteria:

7. **Eligibility for Admission:** Any person passing 10+2 Examinations or equivalent and having basic knowledge about Script may apply for admission to the Programme. However, the Admission Committee reserves the right of approval or rejection of a candidature in special circumstances.

In case of candidates from foreign countries, the following documents along with the filled-in prescribed forms shall have to be submitted at the time applying for admission-

- a) A copy of the valid passport
- b) Visa for the concerned period
- 8. **Session of the Programme:** There will be two sessions for offering the CPMS Programme as below-

a) Winter Session : From 1st September, October to 30th November
 b) Spring Session : From 17th January, February, March to 12th April

Admission Notice for the Winter Session shall be issued in July- August, whereas for Spring Session in November- December every year.

9. **Admission Procedure:** Short-listed eligible candidates shall be invited for interview and counselling on a date to notified by the Admission Committee. If selected, they have to take admission on the same date of interview and counselling. In case of foreign candidates, the Admission Committee may arrange online facilities if required.

Admission Fees, etc. shall be notified on the University website along with the Admission Notice.

10. **Uniform/ Prescribed Attire, etc.:** There may be certain uniform or prescribed attire for attending theory and practical classes. That may be intimated to the students at the time of admission.

C. Conduct of Classes and Examinations:

- 11. At least 90% attendance in the classes (both theory and practical) is compulsory to be eligible to appear before the end semester examinations. In unavoidable circumstances, the course teacher may allow a student to appear before the examinations with at least 80% attendance.
- 12. The Internal Assessment shall be held prior to the end-semester examinations. These assessments shall be conducted by the Course teacher himself/ herself. There shall be no minimum pass mark for internal assessment.
- 13. The Practical Examinations shall be held at the end of the end-semester examinations. These examinations shall be conducted by the Course teacher in presence of an external examiner. There shall be no separate pass mark for practical examinations.
- 14. The End-semester Examinations shall be held at the end of a session. These examinations shall be conducted by the Course teacher as per the schedule notified by the Controller of Examinations . There shall be no separate pass mark for End semester examinations.

15. The End-semester Examinations shall be held at the end of a session. These examinations shall be conducted by the Course teacher as per the schedule notified by the Office of the Controller of Examinations. There shall be no separate pass mark for End semester examinations.

D. Scheme of Examinations:

19. **Special Chance:** In case, a candidate fails an examination or remained absent from appearing, he/ she shall be allowed to appear in the next compartmental/

- regular examination to clear the course/ examination. There shall be two legitimate chances to clear a course/ examination besides the first regular chance.
- 20. **Award of Degree:** On successful completion of the course and earned the prescribed credit with a Letter Grade other than F or Abs, a candidate shall be eligible to get the Award of the *Three-Month Certificate Programme of Manuscript Studies* issued by the Majuli University of Culture.
